# FROM GENERATION TO GENERATION

Beloved in the Lord,

A blessed summer to all of you! I pray that, whether you travel or remain at home during this beautiful and warm season of the year, you may find the peace and the joy (and the rest!) that the Lord

gives to those who trust in Him.

Because of the many who travel over the summer, and the simple need for some rest and preparation period for those who run our various ministries, we take a break during this period from most of our regular parish activities. Along with this, we unfortunately often see a decline in the regular attendance at the Sunday Divine Liturgy, especially from families with young children. This reflects, I think, two realities. The first is that it is a great deal of work to bring children to church, and to guide them in appropriate behavior there. It is natural for any human being to desire and welcome a break, and with the hiatus in Catechism School, a significant reason for being present is indeed absent during the summer. But that brings us to the second reality, which that we too often consider the class-time, the ministry, to be the only reason to bring our children to Church. This way of thinking is natural, as it is one we are familiar with from school, from sports, and from every other activity we bring our children to for which attendance is taken and evaluations are given. But it is simply and utterly wrong. The reason to bring our children to Church is so that they can be in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ, can hear the words of the Gospel, and can receive the Holy Sacraments. These realities transform their lives in a way that even the best-taught class can never do. So I urge you all to not neglect the services of the Church. If you need to, come late (10 am) and leave early (11 am), but come! The Lord is here, and He calls the little children to come to Him! Wherever you are this summer, please make a point to always go to Church on Sunday.

The Disciplines of Christian Parenthood

This discipline, to always be present for the Sunday Liturgy, and to bring our children, is one of the essential habits of effective Christian parenthood. It is the irreplaceable foundation of the Christian life in the home. That said, it is not the ONLY discipline. What we know from statistics and from experience, personal and pastoral, is that children put great value on what they see their parents valuing. This is why loyalty to sports teams is hereditary, why values and behaviors repeat from one generation to the next. If, then, we wish to see our children continue to practice the Christian Faith, we must live the Christian Faith visibly with them during the years that they are growing up in our homes.

There are many ways to do this, and many of us have been blessed to see our parents model this in our own childhood. For those who are uncertain how to begin, however, we have prepared a basic template.

Religious Education Initiative

For the past several months, we have posted a link to the "Religious Education Initiative" on the front page sidebar of the True Vine. If you follow that link on a computer, you will see three columns: the center column contains selected readings from Scripture and from the broader literature of the Orthodox Church, the left column contains instructions for how to use these readings, and the right column contains a very basic set of prayers for families to use. The point of this website is to provide a basic guide for parents to create a consistent space for the Christian Faith in the home. Sacred Mealtime

The core idea of this model of religious education in the home is that it doesn't look like religious education at all. It's not about "teaching" the children anything; it's about the parents having a conversation together about the matter of the Christian Faith, and inviting the children to join them. To this end, we provide three selections each week, one of which parents are urged to read aloud at the dinner table three nights per week. After the reading (which we try to keep brief, between 2-4 minutes long), we recommend some discussion questions. We provide several possibilities, but suggest, to begin with, a very simple question, phrased exactly like this, to every member of the family: "What did you notice in that reading? What jumped out to you?" That this question be asked in this way is important, as it sets the expectation that everyone should notice something, and conditions every member of the household to pay sufficient attention that they will have something to share when their turn comes. For a family beginning this process, we would suggest that initially the father and mother should ask each other this question, and have a brief discussion about the passage in front of the children. After a very little time passes, the children will very likely be eager to have their own say.

We urge parents not to try too hard to teach any particular lesson with these readings. The greatest lesson being taught is implicit, not explicit: namely, that the family cares about the things of God, and takes time to read and discuss them together. Not all questions will have an immediate answer, and this process teaches that it's ok to have questions, and to trust that there is an answer to be found *while* we seek for it. In all this, what we are actually teaching is what Faith in God looks like in real life, and from this, when we come to Church together, we will have real questions that we are seeking to answer together. That this conversation happens over the dinner table will, or can, have the effect of restoring a family ritual around the dinner table that is all to easy to lose in our present day, but which our children will remember with a profound sense of gratitude as a source of stability and certainty amidst all the confusion and fear that we all inevitably face in this world.

A Model, not a Mandate

We provide readings and suggested questions, and a basic family prayer rule as well, but this is not to say that you MUST read and pray what we provide. The intent is simply to make it easy to begin; a family could easily

select their own readings (say, selecting only from one of the Gospels, or reading from the Daily Readings app provided by the Archdiocese once a week, or six times a week, or whatever) or their own prayers. The goal is that a family should read and converse about the things of God, regularly and consistently (but briefly), and should say family prayers together, and that the point of this should overtly and explicitly be for the peace and well being of the *parents*, not of the children. In this way, what we are teaching our children is that our Lord Jesus Christ is the one upon whom we depend, in whom we trust, to keep our lives on an even keel, and to sustain us both in times of peace and times of profound trouble. That is a lesson that they will remember when all the details of every class they have every been taught will have faded from their memory.

### The Wisdom of our Parents

This model, we pray, will be helpful to you all, and we suggest that you try implementing it over the course of the summer, when you (hopefully) have a little bit more spare time as a family. But there is another resource that too often goes untapped, and this is the lived experience of those who are currently grandparents or great-grandparents in our community. We have lived our life with them for as long as we can remember, and it is natural that we take them for granted. That very blessing of their constant presence, however, often obscures the fact that we do not know them or their inner lives as well as we would like. The past 70-90 years through which they have lived are a period that has seen profound change in our world, and it is as real and natural to them as breathing, and as distant to those of us who are younger as are any other events in history.

We recently encountered a book which provides some basic questions which members of a younger generation might ask of their elders (or vice versa), to help us get past the generational divide and to see one another as we see ourselves. For the next several months, our parish administrator, Margaret Clinch, will be writing a brief presentation of one of these questions each month, with some reflections and suggestions regarding how we might engage in these conversations with one another. You can find the first installment on page 10.

We pray that these resources are helpful to you all, both during this summer season, and at all times. Stay safe, stay cool, and may the Lord grant us all to walk the path of salvation together!

# CROSS-GENERATIONAL QUESTIONS

### **Background**

In her book *The Essential Questions: Interview Your Family to Uncover Stories and Bridge Generations*, Dr. Elizabeth Keating writes about how it is so easy to loose stories from our families as the generations go on, as we tend to focus on a few key anecdotes and familiar tales for each person. Some of us, especially those with storytellers in the family, get to a point where we can recite a familiar story word for word. But when we only focus on those select stories, we miss the deep learning and the richer history of our parents and grandparents, and their knowledge of other ways of life.

Keating, coming from an anthropological perspective, suggests taking the time to deliberately sit down and ask broad, open-ended questions from our elders, where we can take in details beyond what we already think we know. In her book, she has formatted this as a sit-down interview session to allow time to dig deeper into family stories, and strongly recommends that the interview be recorded, so that the person asking questions can be present in the moment with their elder, but have something to look back on and review later.

That is certainly a way to go about these questions, and it can be good to dedicate the time to learn from one another. But we can also use these question prompts as part of our ongoing conversations and our regular time together, without having to plan a formal interview.

### The First Questions

It can be hard for a person to start talking about themself or their history, and it's easy for a person to assume that there was nothing special about their life that their grandchildren don't already know. Keating suggests some easier starting questions:

- When were you born?
- Are there any stories about your birth?
- Where were you born? What do you remember about that place?
- Is there a special story behind your name?
- Do you have brothers or sisters? Where are you in the family order?

These may be basic, but there's a lot of space for someone to expand on their answers - to start telling the story of a beloved older relative that they were named after, or to talk about their siblings and how they got along -or did not!


